Jain Irrigation partners with G8's New Alliance for Food and Nutrition Security in Africa

Jain Irrigation Systems Ltd.(JISL) has agreed to partner with G8 & various African nations to invest in Africa on the occasion of "The New Alliance for Food Security in Africa" symposium held on 18th May at Ronald Reagan Building, Washington DC. Prior to the event, Ms. Hillary Clinton hosted the G8 partner organisations and country heads at State House where African Union President Jean Ping, Tanzania President Jakaya Kikwete and Ghana's President Mr. Atta Mills were also present.

JISL has committed investment and projects of USD 375 million over the next few years to build sustainable agriculture and to improve income of small holder farmers in Sub-Saharan Africa. In the coming years, JISL will partner and collaborate with the governments of Kenya, Rwanda, Ethiopia, Mozambique, Tanzania, Ghana, Cote d'Ivoire, Burkina Faso, Nigeria and others.
